Dear Parents



It is good to be back at work after a short period of leave. Can I express my gratitude to Mrs Benkovich and the other members of the leadership team for taking on higher duties both confidently and competently and to the staff for their care in continuing the great work at St Patrick's Parramatta.

A few weeks ago I had the good fortune to see the popular musical 'Matilda'. What a wonderful treat! I was so impressed with so many aspects of this show, from the music, the costumes, the set design and of course the story. What stood out for me however were the amazing talents of the young performers. Not only were they able to sing and dance far better than many adults I know, including myself, but they were able to remember vast pieces of dialogue, get their timing correct, display emotion, work with actors of all ages and work as a team with each other.

I personally just love the theatre, especially musicals and I know from my experience in education that children show us from a very young age their interest in the creative arts. The school is very lucky to have Mrs Rodricks, our music teacher, who is passionate about music and drama. I love being invited to see the published performances as it gives me an opportunity to see our children, just like those in professional musicals, express themselves in exciting and enjoyable ways. Many of them love to get dressed up in costumes and not only do they get an opportunity to perform but Mrs Rodricks also helps them to create their own dialogue and choreography.

I am often mindful that we all have very different gifts and the gifts found within the creative arts are just as important and powerful as the core subject areas. I am also mindful that the increasing emphasis that is placed on standardized tests, like NAPLAN, has a tendency to reduce our measures of success to a very narrow band of skills. No one is denying that a person's ability to be literate and numerate is critical however so is our ability to dream, imagine and create. As always it is about balance. For those who would like to increase the provision of the arts in their family I have included a list of ideas outlined in the article, "The Importance of the Creative Arts for Children and Teens." For genuine change, put the common good first. Special interests manipulate information, offer 'superficial rhetoric, sporadic acts of philanthropy and perfunctory expressions of concern.' (54)

Ideas to encourage the Arts in family life.

- 1. When you read to your children, be dramatic. Act out stories with props and costumes. Encourage them to create their own stories to act out for you. Add to the collection with clothing you no longer need: hats, scarves, purses, shoes, and items you can find inexpensively at garage sales.
- 2. Put together an "art studio" in your home. Stock it with a variety of tools and materials: crayons, markers, finger paints, scissors, pastels, watercolors, brushes, glues, papers of various sizes and textures, intriguing found objects, leftovers from your own home improvement, boxes and containers of all sizes.
- 3. Expand your musical repertoire at home and in the car. Venture into unknown musical territory so that you and the children can hear something out of your usual fare. This can be easily expanded by turning to different radio stations and by checking out CDs from the public library all for free!
- 4. While the music is playing at home, dance together. Teach your children traditional dances you know or improvise with them. Body movement is fun and good exercise.
- 5. Sing together. Teach the kids your favorite songs. Many of them allow for verses that can be made up, such as "Down by the Bay," which can have an endless and hilarious number of rhymes added to it.
- 6. Look for arts programs after school, on weekends, and during vacations. Many community park and recreation departments offer these. Summer camps based on the arts are a good departure from the typical competitive sports camps.
- 7. Create a scrapbook together. Put photos, memorabilia, drawings, and captions together creatively. In doing so, you will not only have a shared experience but a memory that will last for many years (if you use acid-free paper).
- 8. The most important ingredient in the recipe is your interest. Be there to appreciate and encourage during every step of the creative process.


