



Dear Parents,

Last Sunday week I presented the Principal's Report at the Annual General Meeting at St Patrick's Cathedral. It was a good opportunity to let the parish community know a little about what happens at the school and how the school is linked to the parish. It was also good to hear the responses and reports from other groups in the parish and to see the interest that parishioners have in St Patrick's Primary School. St Patrick's Cathedral parish is an old parish with some parishioners having once been members of the St Patrick's School community. I was greeted by many smiling and welcoming faces. Please find below a copy of my report for your interest.

<u>St Patrick's Cathedral Parish</u> <u>Annual General Meeting</u> <u>Sunday 27th August, 2016</u>

Good Afternoon, and thank you for the invitation to speak at your Annual General Meeting. My name is Bernadette Fabri and I am the Principal of St Patrick's Primary School. This is my 3rd Year as principal of the school and can I say I just love being principal of such a dynamic faith and learning community with wonderfully interested students.

Just to give those of you who have no association with the school some background, St Patrick's is a Primary school for children aged 41/2 to 12 years of age. We have 7 grades from Kindergarten to Year 6, each with 2 class groups and approximately 412 students. Enrolment at the school is always very strong with a record of over 130 applications for 62 positions in kindergarten this year for 2017. Most of our graduating students move on to catholic high schools – Catherine McAuley, OLMC, St Pats Dundas, Marist Bros Westmead, and St Patrick's Strathfield.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

- I feel it is very important that the school has a close association with the parish. Our priests and parish staff are always welcome to come to the school.
- Unlike most parish schools we are not on site and the fact that we have to cross the children over busy Victoria Rd is an added complication. None the less we manage very well. Our whole school masses are held in the Cathedral and our primary children are rostered to come to the parish mass every Friday.
- Father Bob comes to the school almost every week to give the children the Sacrament of Reconciliation. He also visits the classes on a roster basis.
- As Principal I am an ex-offico member of the Parish Pastoral Council and attend the monthly meetings regularly.
- Our Religious Education Coordinator Mrs Jude Kerr serves also as another link between the school and the parish and we encourage our staff to attend any sacramental occasion involving students at our school and other parish events, where possible. Eg the Sacrament of Confirmation which was held last Friday night at the Cathedral.
- Religious Education Curriculum is one of our Key Learning Areas and we are currently following the Diocesan Program 'Sharing Our Story'

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- Children in the school are involved in the Diocesan Religious Literacy Assessment in Year 4 and 6. The results of these assessments gives the school very good data regarding what the children are internalising in terms of the knowledge of their faith and the way they interpret key concepts. In other words how the knowledge of their faith is growing.
- Angelus is prayed every day including the office and this is lead by the Student Representative Council members.
- There are many opportunities for prayer in the school including; daily at morning assembly, in the classrooms, at special whole school prayer liturgies and at Friday Assemblies.
- Connection with our Mercy tradition through our study of the work of Catherine McAuley and the history involving the Sisters of Mercy is very important to the school. Our school values are Respect, Resilience and Compassion and these form a theme in which our school culture is developing.

Some of the events and opportunities so far in 2016 include:

- The upgrade of the school façade with the assistance of the Catholic Education Office
- Opportunities to celebrate and build community through, the beginning of the year disco, Mother's Day and Grandparent's Day morning tea and Father's Day breakfast
- Opportunities for children to enrich their learning through; excursions such as Canberra and Bathurst for eg, Life Education, public speaking with Our Lady of Mercy College Parramatta, Visiting guest speakers such as authors and illustrations, Children's Hack Day at Marist Bros Westmead and K to 6 Paper Planes Competition
- Prayer and Religious Education opportunities including, involvement of staff at World Youth Day 2016, the reception of the sacraments of First Eucharist, Reconciliation and Confirmation, the blessing of the ashes on Ash Wednesday, celebration of St Patrick's Day, prayer liturgies at Friday assemblies, weekly attendance at parish masses and school based masses, attendance at special parish masses such as that to remember 'the Way of Mercy' and celebration of Catholic School's Week.
- Opportunities for community involvement such as; attending the Dawn Service on Anzac Day, involvement in NAIDOC Week and regular visits to the local nursing home
- Opportunities to develop Fitness and physical wellbeing such as Touch Football Gala Days, Athletics Carnivals, Walk a thons, Cross Country racing and Soccer Gala Days
- Opportunities for outreach such as St Vincent De Paul Appeal, Pyjama Day to support an Indigenous Australians Group, Baabayn, in Mt Druitt, support for Refugees Appeal.
- These are but a few examples

By way of concluding

The school recognizes the critical place the family plays in the faith development and education of their children and the important role the school plays, in conjunction with the parish, in supporting families. I often remind myself to question; what does it mean to be a Catholic School and how are we different and I feel that when you enter our doors or gates you need to be feeling something special, where people are welcomed and treated with dignity and respect, where there is a spirit of hope and endless possibility, where there is a spirit of reconciliation, where communication is honest and empowering, where every child feels that they are known and understood and loved, where by the time they leave our school they have come to know an ever loving and ever forgiving God through the people that they meet on a daily basis, where they get a sense that learning is not just for themselves but so that they can contribute to our world in many and profound ways and within a Catholic view, where their association with the school enables them to understand that they also belong to a wider community, a Parish Community, an Australian Catholic Community, a World wide Church, and finally where they will always feel as sense of belonging, way beyond their primary school years, so that when they grow up they will say, "I want to send my children to this school". Then we can say we are on the right track.

HOW CAN WE HELP REFUGEES?



At St Patrick's we are going to help the Jesuit Refugee Service, called Arrupe Place, which provides assistance to refugees living in Western Sydney. Arrupe Place has a **foodbank** which provides free fortnightly supplements to refugee families to assist them with their grocery needs. This allows them to spend some of their grocery money on things like rent, bills and medical care.

We are appealing for donations of non-perishable food. *Of course it must be within the used by date.* Items will be collected in the classrooms. The appeal will conclude on **14th September 2016**

Financial Donations

Donations can be made to assist the Jesuit Réfugee Service for asylum seekers in the community. Here are some examples of how financial donations will assist people and their families:

- \$50 could provide a vulnerable family with a supermarket voucher, enabling them to buy essentials such as rice, flour, tea, and fresh vegetables for the week.

- \$150 would provide a fortnightly allowance for the food, travel, and medical needs of asylum seekers living in the JRS Blaiket Shelter in Elizabeth Bay

- \$450 would assist a family seeking asylum with their basic fortnightly living expenses; including food, travel, and medical needs.

- \$40 would pay for an Opal Card to help pay for weekly train and bus fares to get asylum seekers to and from important appointments with lawyers, doctors, and potential employers.
