Dear Parents

This week, children and staff at St Patrick's Parramatta celebrated Book Week. This was an opportunity for us to reflect on the importance of Literacy, in particular Literature, and to celebrate our favourite books or stories. The theme this year expressed how some readers feel about books and encourages children to look for books that inspire and delight them. 'Find Your Treasure' challenges children to look for those little treasures found in stories. As Walt Disney said, 'There is more treasure in books than in all the pirate's loot on Treasure Island.' Some treasures are special places, maybe ideas or imaginary worlds. Some treasures may be finding characters that understand how we feel or have the same dreams we have. Some treasures may help us to imagine a new perspective on a situation or challenge our own perspectives. Treasures in books are there for the taking. They are free gifts donated to us by the author / or illustrator. It is up to us to find them.

Those that love reading feel an intimate bond with some stories and authors and for good readers, that is those who have learned the magic of **visualisation** when reading, snuggling up with a good book is one of life's pleasures. Making movies in our minds as we read - or brain movies - is an important aspect of reading and assists the reader to comprehend with detail what is happening in the text. Good readers visualise before, during and after reading. They visually organise their thinking, visualise the possible content and link background knowledge, as well as form predictions. During reading they begin to form a visual representation of what they are reading.

Interestingly not all readers visualize as they are reading - they are usually those readers that don't enjoy reading. Even adults can fall into this category. 'How do I know if my child is visualizing when reading? I can hear you ask. Here are some ideas:

YES!

Principal

- · Wants to keep reading
- Can give details from the story
- · Laughs or cries when appropriate
- Makes predictions
- Reads with expression
- Can describe the characters
- · Can extend the story beyond the page

NO?

- Lacks interest in reading
- · Can't retell in her own words
- · Lacks interest in finishing
- Can't describe characters, setting, or events from the story

There are many ways to assist children to visualise. Some simple ideas include asking children to draw what they have read - even simple sentences (Sketch to Stretch) or asking them specific questions about the scene they have read or heard. Encourage them to describe these aspects: what (What are they seeing?), size (How big?), colour (What colours are they seeing?), number (How many ______ are there?), shape (What shapes do they see? are there textures or patterns), where (Where is the scene taking place?), movement (Are the characters or objects moving? Are they going up, down, around, twirling, fast or slow etc?), mood (How do you feel as you read/hear? How are the characters feeling?), background (What is in the background in you brain movie?), perspective (How are you seeing the picture? Are you in the picture? Are you looking down at it or looking up?), when (When is the picture happening eg what time of day?), sound, (Are there any sounds in your picture? If this was real would you expect to hear any sounds? What would they be?)

I hope you find some of these ideas helpful. Take some time to discuss your treasured story with your children. Our mum used to share bible stories with us. God bless you and your family Bernadette Fabri

Last term Years 3 and 5 completed the **NAPLAN (National Assessment Program- Literacy and Numeracy)** This was a pencil and paper test.

In August/September 2018, schools in NSW will be participating again in a readiness test of NAPLAN online. This will include Years 3 and 5 at all diocesan schools. The purpose of this is to ensure that schools and school systems are ready for the digital version of NAPLAN which will begin in 2019. Results of this testing will not be made available to schools. Year 3 and 5 children at St Patrick's Parramatta will sit for the online test on the following dates:

Year 3 and 5 mixed discipline test (omnibus): 29/8/2018
