Dear Parents,

Over the last 3 days I have had the pleasure of meeting some of the children and families starting at St Patrick's Parramatta in 2020. Once again the rate of siblings commencing school next year is very high but not as high as previous years, which allowed for a few more new families to gain enrolment. They are all very welcome!

Every year I like to include in the newsletter some tips for new parents of children starting school. This year I have included some words of wisdom from some of the people that know the most about this topic - YOU - experienced parents already at the school. Here are some of their ideas.



- My 'words of wisdom' would be to not hype the start of school too much in the lead up it can be an anticlimactic for some by week 2. Encourage them to make lots of different friends and to move around until they find their tribe. Don't stress about the homework either if it's causing angst at home, speak to your teacher.
- Organisation is key! Prepare as much as you can the night before so that the morning goes as smooth as possible.
- Allow enough time to Arrive at school before the bell to allow your child to settle in before they begin their school day.
- Play games at home and let them lose sometimes so they are able to understand and accept that we don't always win.
- It takes a little while to settle in and it can all seem a little overwhelming at first but you will be amazed at how well the kids (and parents) adjust to the new routine and what they've learnt by the end of the year.
- Frankly speaking, I love our school from the day I've been into the office for the very first time, I remember taking the application for my daughter and filling it in carefully at home, trying to realise, that it is actually happening: "my child is going to school!!!". From that perspective, I can say, that no one parent would ever be ready for any major steps in their kids' journey. But this is ok. We cannot stop our kids from growing but can help them on the way they go. Having said that, I would suggest other Kindy's parents to stop being nervous and start helping kids to make this significant step in their life easier. "Talk a lot" !!! With everyone. First of all with your child! As they keep forgetting what exactly happened from 9 3) On our way home from school I always ask question chronologically trying to help to remember what was in the morning? what did you do in the class? what happened after? It gave me a bit of understanding of their school routine. If, as for an example, in the class, they were talking about the melting process of the ice, I can add the idea of expanding the knowledge by challenging with questions like: "Do you know that there are three states of matter ...?" It would light up kids' curiosity and you can help kids to learn more. Talk to other parents, to the teachers, to the principal. Don't be a stranger when you are dropping off or picking kids up from school. They do not bite. That's ok to ask. If something bothering or annoying come and see Mrs Jones at the office. If you cannot come phone. Cannot phone email. Everyone is reachable and they are really ready to help. And I'm a hundred per cent sure, that this is not our kids, that's the parents are not ready for school))) Kids are excited !!! We just need to let them go.
- Handle your own emotions. Anxiety is contagious parent anxiety can be transmitted to children. Stay calm.
- Be authentic. Children are surprisingly perceptive. They have antennae that tune in to parent behaviour so you need to be genuine.
- Childhood is not a race to see how quickly a child can read, write and count. Childhood is a small window of time to learn and develop at the pace which is right for each individual child.

Please keep these children and their family in your prayers as they commence this very important educational journey with their little ones.

Dear Parents/Guardians

St Patrick's Parramatta Swimming Carnival 2019

In order for our carnival to run smoothly we require the assistance of parent helpers to volunteer their time. If you are able to help on the day could you please phone the office asap.



We appreciate the ongoing support our parents provide and are aware that without your help these days would not run as efficiently.

St Patrick's Swimming Carnival will be held on **Wednesday 20th November 2019 at Granville Swimming Centre.** All students in **Years 2 to 6** will be expected to attend the Carnival and participate in either race events or novelty activities.

Depart School: 9:00am students will catch a bus to the pool and prepare for a 9:30am start.

Depart pool: 2:00pm

What to wear: Students are advised to wear their swimming costume underneath their Sport uniform. Students may choose to wear a coloured t-shirt to represent their House colour. Students must wear a hat and either sandals or joggers.

NO THONGS WILL BE PERMITTED. Coloured zinc is not permitted.

For your child to compete in race events they MUST BE A COMPETENT AND CONFIDENT SWIMMER ABLE TO SWIM 50m WITHOUT STOPPING. All students who nominate to compete will be assessed prior to the commencement of the carnival and given appropriate wristbands to wear. Students competing in race events will be given supervised free' time at the end of the Carnival in the 50m pool if time permits. If your child is not a confident and competent 50m swimmer they will participate in the novelty events only in the smaller pool. They will be under the supervision of teachers and time permitting will receive a couple of sessions. STUDENTS PARTICIPATING IN NOVELTY ACTIVITIES ONLY WILL NOT BE PERMITTED IN THE 50m RACE POOL AT ANY TIME OF THE DAY. The safety of students is paramount and therefore we rely on parents and students to demonstrate their full cooperation.

We look forward to another successful Carnival, weather permitting. Qualifying times for further representation will be based on the student's Heat Time. 50m Freestyle events will be raced in Boys and Girls age groups, however all other events will be raced in Junior, 11 Years and Senior Boys and Girls categories and the 100m Freestyle events in an Open Boys and Girls category.

Carnival Dismissal

Please be aware that this is a school event and therefore <u>all students are expected to attend the Carnival for</u> the full duration of the day as if it were regular school hours.

As the Carnival will run until close to the end of the school day (approx. 2:00pm) we will allow the students to be dismissed from the swimming pool if signed out and accompanied by an adult.

Please understand that although you have indicated that you or another adult will be taking your child home from the pool at the end of the carnival, <u>you are still expected to approach your child's teacher prior to leaving the pool to have the child's name ticked off the roll.</u> Any parent of a child not ticked off will be contacted so we ask for your cooperation to avoid this unnecessary complication.

Christmas Hampers

As the liturgical year draws to a close at the end of this month it seems appropriate to reflect back on the year past and rejoice in the many gifts our Lord has bestowed on us. EXPLORING NUMERACY WITH YOUR CHILD

YEAR 3 TO YEAR 6—Sharing Recipes

Discussing maths when cooking can provide a daily maths lesson involving measurement, time, and cost. Here are some activities you could try at home:

- » Collect and read recipes and discuss the use of fractions, millilitres and grams. Encourage your child to make accurate measurements using measuring cups and spoons.
- » Discuss how you would double or halve a recipe. Encourage your child to record new measurements for the recipe. Discuss why and when you might need to do this.
- »Identify the temperature and cooking time on the recipe. Discuss why different recipes have different temperatures and cooking times.
- » Estimate the cost to buy all the ingredients to make the recipe. Compare this with the actual cost of items. Ask your child if they think it was cheaper to buy the ingredients and make dinner or get takeaway.
- » Make a list of the abbreviations used in the recipe and then write them in full for example, L for litre, ml for millilitre, tsp. for teaspoon, tbsp. for tablespoon.
- » Investigate the prices of fresh fruit and vegetables available in the supermarkets compared with market vendors.

In some sports only 2 students per school can be nominated. Please complete all fields and specially "Representative Experience".

Your child's school will notify you one week prior to the trial date if your child is to attend to the Parramatta Diocesan trial for their selected sport by providing a trial information sheet.

Under no circumstances will a child be eligible to trial if the Online Registration Form has not been completed and approved by the school by the closing date.

2020 Team Sport Trials

Parramatta Diocese 2020 Information For Parents of current Year 4 and Year 5 students

Please note that the full day trials will be for boys cricket, boys soccer, boys rugby league & boys rugby union.

Due to the popularity of boys cricket, boys soccer and grits netball a maximum of 2 children only are eligible to trial from each school. Selection of the 2 boys and grits will be made jointly by the school sport coordinator and principal. Discretion can be sought.

Half day trial for tennis and netball... all other trials will be held after school beginning at 4pm

MACKILLOP TRIAL

It should be noted that the main purpose of the Mackillop trial is to select a team to compete at the NSWPSSA Championships, The Inter-Diocesan MacKillop Trial is not a competition although a round robin format is often used to lacilitate the selection procedure.

NSW PSSA CHAMPIONSHIPS

Children who are successful at being selected in the Mackillop feam will compete at the NSWPSSA Championships. These championships involve three or four days of competition at various locations in NSW. Children selected in these teams may also be required to attend training sessions. At the NSW PSSA Championships a State feam will be selected to participate at the School Sport Australia Inter State Exchange for some sports.

SCHOOL SPORT AUSTRALIA

To be considered for selction in the NSWPSSA state team for participation at all School Sport Australia 12 Years & Under championships: Students mus be turning between the ages of 10 and 12 in the year of competition i.e. Students turning the ages of 8, 9 and 13 in the year of competition are not eligible for NSWPSSA State selection.

2020 school travel applications now open

Applications for student travel in 2020 opened on Friday, 11 October 2019.

Students progressing to year 3 and year 7 no longer need to re-apply *if* they:

- are continuing at the same school
- are residing at the same address
- have not been sent an expiry notification from Transport for NSW.

Where a student meets the new distance eligibility, the system will automatically update their entitlement. If they do not meet the new eligibility, they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

If students need to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails

Applications need to be submitted before 31 December 2019 to ensure student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card is not cancelled. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2019, the system will automatically cancel an entitlement/card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2020.
