## **Vision / Mission Statement**

#### Rationale

- Road crashes are the major cause of accidental death of young children and adolescents in New South Wales
- Schools have the major responsibility for the education of students. Education can be an
  effective means of influencing the development of positive attitudes and safe behaviours
  in children and adolescents.

### **Definition**

• The Road Safety Education Program is a program designed to develop knowledge, skills, attitudes and values of safe road use.

#### Aims

- To provide a Road Safety Education Program that will address the development of knowledge, skills, attitudes and values relating to road use.
- For the school community to work to reduce road trauma through a quality education program.

#### **Implementation**

#### 1. Planning and Procedures

 St Patrick's Parramatta School will provide a comprehensive and integrated road safety program that will meet the needs of our students. The program will focus on the Key Learning Area (KLA) of Personal Development, Health and Physical

- Education. We will also identify other appropriate KLA's where road safety education can be included.
- St Patrick's Parramatta School will take into consideration the education needs and developmental stage of the students
- When designing our Road Safety Education Program we will take into consideration the local environment and actively seek to involve the community in improving road safety in the local area.
- In developing the St Patrick's Parramatta School Road Safety Education Program we will actively seek parental and community participation and support.

# **Evaluation**

In accordance with the St Patrick's Parramatta School Review and Development Cycle this policy will be reviewed annually

Pedestrian     Movement	Students departing school grounds have only one exit. This is done through the Ross St exit which takes the students to the front of the school and to parent car pick up.		
	This exit is supervised by teachers who ensure that children are either with an adult, have permission from parents to walk or are walking towards the teachers on car pick up duty. Teachers on duty ensure student movement is safe. Another teacher on crossing duty supervises the students crossing the road between the school crossing flags and walks them to the bus stop. A teacher from the neighbouring high school is on duty with a flag at the crossing on Ross Street at 3.20pm (high school dismissal) The school is currently on a waiting list for a govt funded crossing supervisor.		
	Students moving on mass at any time of the school day are encouraged to use footpaths and not walk in front of parked cars.		
	Parents are encouraged to use the available zebra crossings at all times.		
	Parents are urged to follow car pick up safety guidelines such as: Children entering cars from footpath side only Children not to walk behind waiting cars Parents never to leave their vehicle if using car pick up Parents to follow all road rules and driver rules.		
2. Bus Zone	There is <b>no designated bus zone</b> connected with St Patrick's Parramatta. Children catching public buses (approx 2 ch'n) assemble in front of the canteen and are then walked down to the bus stop at 3.05pm by a teacher who crosses with them at the crossing, walks them through the park and ensures they are safe to catch their bus. If the bus does not arrive by 3.25pm the children are walked back to school and parents called.		

	The only children who arrive by bus are those that go to before school care and are supervised by OOSH staff.
3. Bus travel and Safety	Students who travel on buses line up before boarding the bus.
	Students are instructed on bus safety.
Parent delivery and collection of students	There a two waiting areas for students who are to be collected by parents/carers.
	Area 1 COLA - Walk Children wait in the COLA if they are being picked up by their parents/carers. This area is supervised by a teacher. Students are to wait in this area until the teacher gives permission for them to leave. This will happen when the teacher has a line of sight for the parent/caregiver. Parents/caregivers are encouraged to collect them and take them to parkedcars (holding child's hand) or by walk.
	With the change of dismissal time at OLMC children waiting for their older siblings wait in their classrooms and will be called to the COLA at 3.20pm for sibling pick up.
	Parents are encouraged to comply with legal requirements at all times and this is regularly advertised in the school newsletter.
	Area 2 Classrooms - Car Children waiting to be picked up by car wait in their classrooms from 3.00pm to 3.25pm. When their name is called over the loudspeaker they walk to the Ross Street gate where they will walk to the teachers on pick up duty and supervised getting into their car.  At 3.20pm all children not picked up are called to the COLA.  After 3.30pm children are supervised in the school office until they are picked up.
	Students being delivered in the morning alight from their cars proceed along the footpath and into the school grounds.
5. School deliveries	Delivery vehicles are encouraged to drive to the front of the school.
	No vehicles are permitted on school ground during school hours unless prior arrangement and proper supervision is provided for vehicle entering / exiting school ground.
	When it is necessary for cars to enter the playground 'Lock in' Procedures will be called
School Sport	
Travel to and from venues	When students travel to and from sporting venues by bus, safe bus travel procedures as per risk assessments.
	A registered bus company is used.
	When walking to a venue in the local area, students are lead by a teacher. Footpaths and pedestrian rules are followed at all times eg. students walking as far away from the edge of the road as possible and children waiting at least a metre away from the edge of the road at the lights.

	Students will be closely observed when crossing the road and the teachers will be the first and the last persons on and off the road.
	Parent helpers are engaged to assist with all local walks other than walking to St Patrick's Cathedral Parramatta.
Excursions	
Travel to and from venues	Students travel to and from excursion/sporting venues by bus or are taken by their own parent/caregivers to representative sporting events.
	Risk assessments apply for all excursions and sporting events.
	A designated assembly area at the destination is pre-organised.
