Dear Parents

I know that as parents you take the responsibility of caring for your children's physical well being very seriously. You ensure that they have nutritious food to eat, get enough sleep and exercise, and get regular checks with their doctor. Emotionally you show them love and how to be good communicators. You role model what it is like to be a good citizen, friend and community member and demonstrate how to solve problems and demonstrate forgiveness in a calm and effective way. Intellectually you support their learning by being involved and interested in what they are doing at school, assist them with their homework and provide them with rich experiences and discussions on the weekends or during holiday time. One vital aspect of parenting in our fast and information rich world which is sometimes neglected is their spiritual needs. One of the main reasons for sending your child to a Catholic school is to ensure that the child will grow spiritually as well as physically, intellectually, socially and emotionally. The school endeavours to support parents in this journey with their children.

Lent is a wonderful time for the family to stop and reflect on life and what is really important. Even during the time of Lent many of us are still getting caught up trying to manage life's daily demands. We might attend mass and listen to the words of scripture but often our hearts and thoughts are with our family worries, the decisions we have to make and other distractions. What we often forget however is that even in these times God is with us, supporting us, gently calling us to stop, be calm, and feel God's peace-filled presence. Prayer and meditation is a family 'habit' worth establishing. The school teaches the children about the importance of prayer but if they never experience prayer in the home it becomes a 'school' experience rather than an authentic real life application for them. I have heard it said that "faith which is only experienced at school will eventually be taken off with one's school uniform at the end of a child's schooling". I think there is real truth in this saying.

Tomorrow we will be ceasing school for a time for the Easter Holidays. I know for many children it is a time for Easter Eggs and the Easter Show however amongst all the celebrations let us remember the importance of attending the Holy Week Celebrations. St Patrick's Cathedral have a number of opportunities at which you can join, in community, to remember the Easter story. Let us show what we truly value by ensuring our spiritual needs and that of our children are met and strengthened by spending sometime in prayer.

Measles outbreak in western Sydney

There is currently an outbreak of measles in South Western and Western Sydney, with at least 9 people having acquired the disease in the region during March.

The reported cases include children and infants who have attended childcare centres and secondary schools. There is potential for the measles outbreak to spread further as the infected young people have large social networks both within and outside of their schools, and some have travelled on public transport whilst infectious. Measles is highly infectious and anyone who isn't vaccinated is at risk of infection if they have had contact with an infectious case.

Immunisation is effective in preventing measles. It is important for everyone to ensure that they have received at least two doses of measles containing vaccine (MMR). Infants and young children are vaccinated with measles containing vaccine at 12 months and 18 months of age. Older children and adults born during or after 1966 should ensure that they have been vaccinated with two doses of vaccine. Unless people are certain they have had two doses of measles vaccine, they should visit their GP as soon as possible for **free** measles vaccination.

The first sign of measles is usually a high fever, a runny nose, cough, and red, watery eyes. The rash usually starts on the face and upper neck and spreads over the body, hands and feet. The rash lasts for 4-7 days.

People with measles symptoms should seek medical advice as soon as possible phoning the emergency department or GP beforehand, stay home from work or school, and limit other activities to avoid exposing other vulnerable people, such as infants, to the infection.

How to keep your child safe online

Here are some tips for parents to keep your child safe online

BE SAFE

- Be aware of how your child uses the internet and explore it with them
- Set rules and monitor to make sure your child knows what information they can share or post online and which websites they can visit
- Teach your child to tell a trusted adult if they feel uncomfortable about something they have found on the internet or received in an email
- Discuss with your child the importance of keeping personal information private. This sort of information can be used to identify or locate where they live, go to school or activities in which they are involved

BE RESPECTFUL

- * Talk to your children about cyberbullying. Online communication should be responsible and respectful
- Children and adolescents who are being cyberbullied sometimes change their behaviour. If you are concerned they might be a victim of cyberbullying, talk to them and tell them you are concerned. Arrange to talk to a teacher or school counsellor
- Advise your child not to respond to any negative messages and to keep evidence. Tell them to report any negative messages they receive to you or another trusted
- Children and their parents can contact social media companies and ask for defamatory material to be taken down. If the material is not gone within 48 hours, a complaint can be lodged with the Office of the Children's eSafety Commissioner at www.esafety.gov.au

BE RESPONSIBLE

- Consider using inbuilt filters and controls on your digital devices and home network to manage your children's online access. Keep your virus protection up to date
- Talk with your child about being careful when downloading files or clicking on links. Some files or links may be harmful viruses or trying to obtain personal information
- Certain online activities (downloading illegal videos or music, plagiarism, sexting, identity theft, 'hacking' networks) are illegal and can result in criminal charges
