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

Dear Parents

for the months ahead. For the rest of the year, 1S will be taught by Ms Jemma Dimarco who is known to the children through her work at the school on a casual basis. I would like to welcome Ms Dimarco to St Patrick's School and I know that she is really looking forward to teaching Year One.

For those they may not have heard, Father Bob Bossini has been appointed Parish Priest and Dean of St Patrick's Cathedral from September. DISMISSAL TRIAL

In an effort to ensure that children experience a safe and happy dismissal from school we will be trialing a new pick up system in the afternoons. This system was suggested by one of our families. The process involves children sitting in 3 separate sections of the playground. The following sections are as follows:



- Children going to **after school care** will be seated in the section under the hall, (the cave)
- Children getting picked up by parents and other family members from the playground will be seated in the amphitheatre. We ask that these parents and children leave from the Ross St gate opposite OLMC to help eliminate congestion.
 - Children waiting for their names to be called out for car pick up will be seated under the shelter as per usual.
- Children walking home can leave from the Villiers street gate as per usual.
- Any child who is unsure how they are getting home will be seated under the shelter with the 'drive through' children.

NB All children will be fully supervised at all times. As this is a trial this procedure will be reviewed later this term. Thank you to the parents who have already given us feedback.
