Dear parents,

During the year two of our remarkable teachers, Mrs Sam Pope and Mrs Christina Nubla, have been working on a project with students on the Student Representative Council. This project involved developing a student incentive program based on the values of Catherine McAuley. Our goal this term is to ensure that the children have a great understanding of Catherine McAuley. The children will be learning about Catherine McAuley's life, the values she embraced and why she is important.

As we introduce the school community to this project it is important that we understand the values underpinning the project and reflect on the life of Catherine McAuley. During assemblies, the SRC students will be delivering short presentations on Catherine McAuley, to re-introduce her to the wider school community.

At the remaining assemblies this term we will be introducing three mascots to the students and parents as part of the incentive program. These mascots are Ricky Respect, Coolio Compassion and Rocky Resilience. These mascots were designed by the teaching staff and the final concept designs were produced by Melissa Nutter. We thank her for the wonderful work she has done and can't wait to unveil these curious and interesting characters.

We thank all the staff for their contributions to this project, particularly Mrs Pope and Mrs Nubla, for all their hard work in making this come to fruition. We know the children will love the characters and hope that their messages will help to make St Patrick's Primary School an even more welcoming and compassionate place. This incentive program will become part of our Student Management Policy in 2015.

Next week we welcome back Miss Fabri. I know that you will make her return to 'normal' school life as smooth as possible following her pilgrimage. We look forward to hearing all about the special places she has visited during her travels.

After School 'Drive Through' Alert

Can I impress upon you once again the importance of ensuring the safety of our children and other drivers by adhering to the road rules in place around the school. I understand the frustration of parents having to drive around a number of times before they can join the line of cars. We often drive around car parks in a similar fashion looking for that one spot to park. VERY FRUSTRATING!

We have requested the regular presence of parking officers in the afternoon and also have the support of OLMC staff to ensure the high school students follow the same rules as our students. The safety in our school zones is paramount and failure to disregard the 'No Stopping' signs incurs a fine of \$300 and 2 demerit points. It also causes more congestion than is necessary by gridlocking the round-a-bouts.

This service was introduced many years ago as a convenience to parents but since its inception there have been a lot more developments in the area. We are monitoring the situation closely and keep in regular contact with both the police and parking rangers.

Some points needing attention that would assistance in providing a better service are that you:

- Make sure your car is parked fully within the marked white line near the round-a-bout (Not in the NO STOPPING area)
- Ensure you display your family name sign where it can be easily seen (have one in both cars if necessary)
- Cross the road at the crossing not in between the cars outside the school

For your convenience children can be picked up using the drive through pick up from 3.00 to 3.30pm.

Remember PATIENCE is a virtue!
