Dear Parents

Yesterday was Ash Wednesday and this day marks the beginning of the Church season of Lent. For some of our Maronite community the commencement of Lent is celebrated on Ash Monday. The school began their preparations for Ash Wednesday with the burning of the palms ceremony on the playground, lead by the Dean of our Cathedral Father Bob Bossini. He was ably assisted by Michael Lilley and Chris Ohlsen from the parish. Fr Bob reminded us that on Ash Wednesday the blessed ashes will be placed on our foreheads, as a sign of God's unconditional love for us. On Ash Wednesday, Years 1 to 6 went to mass and they received the ashes on their foreheads. As part of Fr Bob's beautiful homily he spoke of the symbol of ash on our forehead as a sign that we are Jesus' ambassadors. He also spoke of the importance of three actions during this time of Lent; To fast and in doing so to remember all those, in our country and around the world, that do not have as much as we do, to give alms by being charitable, especially through Project Compassion and to Pray.

In this year's Lenten Message from our Holy Father, **Pope Francis'** asks us to meditate on scripture and practise, with intensity, the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy. He warns us of getting distracted by knowledge, power and riches and asks that like Our Lady, Mary the Mother of God, we demonstrate, generosity, faithfulness and compassionate goodness, especially as shown in marriage and family relationships. He states:

For all of us, then, the season of Lent in this Jubilee Year is a favourable time to overcome our existential alienation by listening to God's word and by practising the works of mercy. In the corporal works of mercy we touch the flesh of Christ in our brothers and sisters who need to be fed, clothed, sheltered, visited; in the spiritual works of mercy — counsel, instruction, forgiveness, admonishment and prayer — we touch more directly our own sinfulness. The corporal and spiritual works of mercy must never be separated. By touching the flesh of the crucified Jesus in the suffering, sinners can receive the gift of realizing that they too are poor and in need. By taking this path, the "proud", the "powerful" and the "wealthy" spoken of in the Magnificat can also be embraced and undeservedly loved by the crucified Lord who died and rose for them. This love alone is the answer to that yearning for infinite happiness and love that we think we can satisfy with the idols of knowledge, power and riches. ...Let us not waste this season of Lent, so favourable a time for conversion! We ask this through the maternal intercession of the Virgin Mary, who, encountering the greatness of God's mercy freely bestowed upon her, was the first to acknowledge her lowliness (cf. Lk 1:48) and to call herself the Lord's humble servant (cf. Lk 1:38).

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


CONCERNS

IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING AFTERNOON PICKUP AND ARRANGEMENTS FOR KINDERGARTEN TERM 1

PICK UP AFTER SCHOOL

Kindergarten will be collected in the afternoon for Term 1 from their classrooms

Afterschool Care: At 3.00pm children going to afterschool care will assemble in the space under the hall (the cave) where they will be counted and organised by the after school care personnel.

Children being picked up by parents from the playground: Children being picked up by parents, family members etc. from the playground will be seated in the ampitheatre until 3.15pm. If not collected by this time then they will go back to their classroom to await pick up.

Children being picked up by car (Ross Street): Children who are being picked up by car will remain in their classrooms so that they can effectively hear their names being called out by the teacher on duty. They will then walk to the Ross Street gate and wait with the teacher who will assist them to enter their car.

Children who are unsure: Children who are unsure of how they are getting home will wait in their classrooms just in case their names are called out. They can be picked up from the classrooms if necessary.

Car pick up: The pick up area in Ross Street in front of the school is used for parents to stop for afternoon pick up. Parents are asked not to leave the car in this section to pick up children. A large sign with your family name displayed on the dashboard of the car is necessary to enable teachers to easily identify you and call your child to the car (last name then children's name). Please co-operate by moving to where the teacher on car duty directs you.

ROAD SAFETY GUIDELINES

- Please advise your child how they will be getting home so as to minimise their distress. If you are unsure, remind them to stay in their classrooms.
- Cars are not permitted to stop at anytime in the red "No Stopping Zone"
- Please ensure that you cross at the safety crossing (yellow lines). It is very dangerous to cross busy streets in between cars.
- Please be careful when driving near the crossing as we have had some concerns from pedestrians placed in potentially dangerous situations with cars not stopping.
- Please do not drop off and pick up from the Ross Street driveway. Reversing back is very dangerous with so many children about.
- Parents must display on the dash board of their car, a large sign clearly marked with the student's family name and christian name to avoid delays
- Drivers are not permitted to leave the car while in the restricted parking zone
- Cars are not to block traffic on the round-a-bout
- Parents are requested to proceed in the queue to the teacher on duty who will direct your child/children to your car
- For safety reasons the child/children should enter the car from the footpath side.
 Entry into the car should not be obscured by any items including infants car seat/baby capsule.
- Please notify the school if you are running late to pick up your child. Children become distressed if they think they have been forgotten.
- To try to alleviate congestion the pick up time from school is between 3.00pm to 3.30pm. Please try to stagger your arrival. The children are fully supervised.
- To assist in the smooth running of the pick up routine, police and parking ranger patrols regularly to monitor drivers and will fine those who are breaching road rules.
