


# St Patrick's Primary School Newsletter

## 15th September 2016 Term 3 Issue 9



Dear Parents

A few weeks ago children in Years 3 and 5 received their National Assessment Program –Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) results for 2016. Children sat for these assessments earlier in the year, from the 10<sup>th</sup> of May to the 12<sup>th</sup> May and elements of learning tested included: aspects of literacy such as; reading, spelling, punctuation and grammar and writing, as well as numeracy. Whilst we understand that these results are only indicators or how the students performed on the one day, it is always satisfying for the school to get very good results; and this year was no exception. The online package that comes to schools to support the NAPLAN data is extensive and the teachers and teacher leaders are still analyzing where the school made significant gains and areas for further development. Some of the analysis so far is as follows:

### YEAR 3

- 58 students sat for NAPLAN 2016
- No children were withdrawn or absent
- The percentage of students below national minimum standards = 0%
- The percentage of students in the top two bands ie Bands 5 and 6 were above the state in all areas
- Areas of particular strength this year were grammar & punctuation and writing, followed closely by spelling, reading and numeracy
- Trend data is showing that the scores are well above that of the state in all areas.

### YEAR 5

- 54 students sat for NAPLAN 2016
- No children were withdrawn or absent
- The percentage of students below national minimum standards = 2% - 4% in 3 of the 5 areas tested
- The percentage of students in the top two bands ie Bands 7 and 8 were above the state in all areas
- Areas of particular strength this year were reading, spelling and numeracy followed closely by grammar and punctuation and writing
- Trend data is showing that the scores are above that of the state in all areas, with steep improvements in the areas of reading, grammar & punctuation and overall best results in numeracy.
- Many students showed significant growth in all areas from Years 3 to 5. A topic for further consideration is to investigate why some students reach or excel beyond the expected growth and why some do not.

Teachers will continue to use the NAPLAN results to assist them to; better understand the learning needs of individual students in their class, to observe patterns and trends in specific question items and to take further action to target specific literacy and numeracy skills.

When viewing these results, as a school or as a family, is important to remember that children will be sitting a number of formal assessments throughout their school lives and that many of the skills they possess are not always assessed in these types of tests.

Children who have artistic or sporting ability, problem solvers and those possessing interpersonal skills, those able to synthesize information and creative thinkers, for example, are not able to demonstrate their talent in Literacy and Numeracy assessments of this kind. The skills of acting or dancing are not tested and the ability to be flexible or to use curiosity to further develop learning are not considered in these results. Children who have the ability to 'bounce back' from set backs are not acknowledged either. Whilst we encourage our students to do their very best on the day of the tests we are aware that results can vary and a student who may in fact be quite a good writer, for example, may not produce their best piece of writing on that particular day. My message to all students is always, 'You are not your report or your results, you are so much more!'





## PAT-R Testing

Children from Yr 2 to 6 are currently sitting the PAT- R standardised tests. These tests are completed online. The PAT -R tests are used to monitor progress in reading comprehension and provide teachers with diagnostic information for setting realistic learning goals and planning effective programs.

This assessment enables us to:

- Track students' literacy progress from year 2 through to year 6.
- Identify students who require help to develop literacy skills and students who would benefit from literacy extension.
- Use results to confirm school-based assessment.
- Use information, based on the question types, to plan literacy teaching strategies.

The results of this assessment will be available to the school by the middle of term 4.


