Dear Parents

Last Tuesday was the feast of All Saints Day. On the Feast of All Saints Day in 2013 Pope Francis stressed that the saints are not "supermen" or women, who are "born perfect," but rather are ordinary people who followed God "with all their heart." He said, "They are like us, they are like each of us, they are people who before reaching the glory of heaven lived a normal life, with joys and griefs, struggles and hopes," Pope Francis reminds us that "They spent their lives in the service of others, they endured suffering and adversity without hatred and responded to evil with good, spreading joy and peace," When reading his sermon to the pilgrims on this feast day I was very impressed with the wisdom of our Holy Father's words. I think that when we think of saints we think of extraordinary people whom we could not possibly emulate, but Pope Francis dismisses this assumption by encouraging us with an alternative view.

I would like to share with you some of his reflections and encourage you to discuss these with your children.

- Each saint changed his or her life "when they recognized the love of God, they followed him with all their heart, without conditions and hypocrisies."
- "The saints give us a message. They tell us: be faithful to the Lord, because the Lord does not disappoint! He does not disappoint ever, and he is a good friend always at our side."
- "To be a saint is not a privilege of a few... all of us in baptism have the inheritance of being able to become saints. Sanctity is a vocation for everyone."
- "All of us are called to walk in the way of sanctity, and this way has a name, a face: the face of Jesus Christ."
- "The saints are men and women who have joy in their hearts and spread it to others. Never hating, but serving the other, is the greatest need. To pray and to live in joy: this is the way of sanctity!"
- "The saints encourage us with their witness not to have fear of going against the current or fear
 of being misunderstood and derided when we speak of the Lord and of the Gospel,"
- "They show us with their lives that the one who remains faithful to God and to his words experiences now on this earth the comfort of his love and then experiences it a 'hundredfold' in eternity."

Beautiful words! Beautiful thoughts to put into action!





NSW PSSA Mackillop Rugby Union 2016

The Primary School Mackillop Rugby team is a representative team that is made up of players from catholic schools from across 5 NSW Catholic Diocese. The 5 Diocese are:

Parramatta, Sydney, Wollongong, Canberra/Goulburn & Wagga Wagga. So long as you go to school in one of these diocese you too have the chance to represent Mackillop.

These boys have travelled a very long journey to receive this award. To gain selection in the Mackillop team, they first had to trial and make the Parramatta Diocesan Rugby team. The Parramatta Diocese is comprised of 47 parishes & 83 schools. Trials are normally held in June and normally comprise of a skills session and trial games held over 1 day. Although trials are held in June registration closes by the end of February.

After gaining selection to represent Parramatta and after a couple of training sessions the boys then travelled to Forbes for a full day Rugby carnival against

other Diocese from NSW. This was the Mackillop Rugby Union Regional trials and where every Catholic primary school from every diocese in NSW is represented. The players were watched very carefully by a panel of selectors including the 2 Mackillop coaches and 3 NSW Rugby development officers. If they played really well they would be selected into the Mackillop Rugby team.

These boys were fortunate to be selected! That's where the real challenge started. Preparations were now underway for the NSW PSSA Rugby Carnival that was held in Mudgee over 3 days. The best primary school Rugby Union players in NSW were competing for the trophy you see here today. There were 13 teams competing - over 280 players, representing Catholic, Public & Independent Primary Schools from across NSW.

The Mackillop Rugby Union team has one of the largest catchments in the state. Players joined together to form our team from as far as Yass, Wagga Wagga, Goulburn, Queanbeyan and across Sydney.

This Rugby team of young men were not the biggest players by a long way. But what they lacked in size they made up in Team Spirit and they quickly bonded coming together as if they had played together their whole lives. These boys made new friends which will last a life time.

Day 1 saw the MacKillop team play against Sydney South West (one of the biggest teams at the carnival) who we beat 15-0, Riverina 49-0 & South Coast 42-5.

On Day 2 the boys faced Polding our catholic school rivals in the Quarter Finals whom we also defeated 15-5. We then played Hunter in the Semi Finals and again the boys were successful winning 21-7.

Day 3 the boys faced off against The giant Sydney South West team in the grand final. After conceding the first try the boys courage & determination to

great 33-14. They were crowned as undefeated champions and were presented this shield that you see here today.

Mackillop has only won this trophy twice in the 60 year history of the competition and these boys went through the tournament undefeated!!

To top off a great week, 5 boys from the MacKillop team were selected to represent NSW at the School Sports Australia Rugby Union Carnival! 2 of these boys came from Parramatta Diocesan.

If you think you have what it takes to represent your Diocese, your Region & your State then we encourage you to put up your hand next year. It's not every day that an opportunity like this comes along.

If you are really committed we would suggest you join your local rugby club where you can develop your skills so that you shine at diocesan trials.
