Dear Parents.

Welcome back to Term 2! I hope you all had a restful and enjoyable time with your family during the term break. We have another very busy term coming up, and wish Ms Fabri a wonderful break as she spends some special time with her family.

On Monday 30th April, the staff gathered for a Staff Development Day at Aengus Kavanagh Centre in Mt Druitt. The day consisted of activities which explored the key ideas relating to geometric and spatial reasoning through the use of 'hands on' activities with practical implications for the classroom. Teachers found themselves back in the classroom and were challenged to develop their use of spatial language and visualisation. All staff are excited to share what they have been learning with their students throughout the term.

On Tuesday 8th May the school will be undergoing the process of Peer Review. All schools in the Diocese of Parramatta undertake Peer Review every year: The school was informed last month of the date and was later informed of the key sample areas to be audited. This year, the curriculum documents the school will be presenting are, Religious Education and Creative Arts with the focus on Stage 1, Year 1 and Year 2.

By way of further explanation:

Peer Review is a key part of the School Compliance audit process which allows all schools to view, assess and provide critical feedback on the curriculum presented by the school being reviewed.

This model of **Peer Review** has been approved by **the NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA)** in 2014 for the registration period (2015-2019) and is unique to Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta (CEDP) in the current form and structure of implementation.

Other areas audited during this period include; Attendance, timetables, Working with Children Checks, Child Protection matters, Teacher Accreditation and Complaints and Grievances management.

The staff representing the school for Peer Review this year are: Mrs Masefield, Ms Onorato, Ms Azar and Mrs Daou. They will be accompanied by Mrs Standring in her capacity as Acting Assistant Principal and myself.



Winter Uniform Changeover



CONGRATULATIONS JOSEPH!!



- Each year the cost of children participating in ICAS is increasing.
- Only a small number of children participate each year.
- The reports given do not give staff any significant information on children's learning and how to assist them to improve or be challenged
- The method of testing is not in line with the school's preferred strategies that promote higher order thinking.

BUILDING CHILD SAFE COMMUNITIES – NEW FORMS FOR ALL VOLUNTEERS AND CONTRACTORS

Building Child Safe Communities' is a new initiative developed by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta that enhances our commitment to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all students in our care. It is now a requirement that all volunteers and contractors complete an online undertaking form that confirms expectations in relation to behaviour whilst volunteering or contracting at schools, Catholic Out of Schools Hours Care and Catholic Early Learning Centres. This undertaking form also seeks to determine the suitability of volunteers and contractors by requiring them to declare that they do not have a criminal history involving children.

You will receive a confirmation email once the form has been submitted. Your details are maintained confidentially in a central database and a copy of your confirmation is emailed to the location where you are contracting.



Essential Safety Equipment

KNEE/ELBOW GUARDS

Designed to protect vulnerable points that research has shown are common points of contact in falls

Very important for

- Skateboarding boarders commonly land on their knees
- Rollerbladers land on knees and elbows
- Scooter riders most prone to falls

WRIST GUARDS

- Designed to strengthen the wrist area so that a child falling and putting out a hand to break the fall is less likely to damage or break a wrist.
- Wrist injuries are very common for skateboard, rollerblade, scooter and micro-scooter riders.

VISIBILITY

Wheeled devices should not be used in poor light or near traffic.

Items useful to increase visibility to pedestrians and vehicles are:

- Bright coloured clothing
- Reflective tape
- Reflectors
- Visibility Flags



Safety tips to help our kids on their wheels

SAFE LEARNING/SAFE USE


It is important that children learn to use wheeled vehicles under adult supervision in safe environments, particularly learning to stop and to steer.

This means areas away from uneven surfaces, slopes and other users. Road authorities advise that child users of all wheeled toys should be accompanied by an adult until age 9 or 10, depending on the child's individual development.

KIDS ON WHEELS

Safety tips to help our kids on their wheels



opular presents with wheels include tricycles, bicycles, skateboards, in-line skates, rollerblades and the fads of the moment, micro-scooters, surfing and mega-scooters.

KEY SAFETY MESSAGES

TRICYCLES

- Ensure the product is the right size for the child.
- Ensure that it is stable.
- Provide a safe area to use it away from slopes, stairs and changes in level.
- Both the child's feet should be able to touch the ground when they are seated

BICYCLES

Size

Most bicycle injuries are the result of the child losing control of the bike (about 85%), so getting the right size is vitally important.

A child should be able to touch the ground with both feet while seated in the saddle. Safety equipment on the bicycle is

- Brakes
- Lights
- Reflectors
- Bells
- 👃 Visibility devices (reflective tape, flags, etc)

SKATEBOARDS AND ROLLERBLADES

- The most common injuries result from falls, although there have been injuries and deaths associated with running into vehicles and pedestrians.
- The rollerblades need to be a comfortable, firm fit on the child's feet.

MICRO-SCOOTERS

- These relatively new devices are associated with fall injuries.
- 66% of those injured are under 14 years.
- There are reports of injuries associated with collisions with vehicles and pedestrians.
- Watch out for unsafe construction, with sharp objects and finger-tightened mechanisms.
- Can be very unstable due to small wheels.
- Braking system can be inadequate at the speeds that can be generated.





Essential Safety Equipment

HELMETS

- Helmets are the most important piece of safety equipment and are intended to protect children's heads in the event of a fall.
- Studies on cyclists show that a helmet reduces the risk of brain injury by around 90%.
- In order to be effective, the helmet has to be well fitting. A good test is to put the helmet on and then push gently with the heel of the hand against the front of the helmet. If it easily moves around, then it does not fit.
- To be effective, a helmet also has to be used!
- Parents need to make it clear to children that helmets are to be used every time.
