Dear Parents.

Last Sunday at my local parish mass I was inspired by a beautiful homily delivered by our priest on the Nativity of St John the Baptist. He spoke about the mystery of God's involvement in the birth of three key biblical figures: Our Lord Jesus Christ, Our Lady, Mary his mother and St John the Baptist. Father reminded us that just like God had a hand in the lives of these special people he was instrumental in our birth also. He commented on how, with love and through love, all people are made in God's image and how he knows us intimately by name.

Names are so very important and as many of us have experienced we feel a sense of relationship and closeness when someone knows our name and refers to us using it, which is critical to our identity. The various names people call us is often an indicator to the level and nature of our association with them. Sometimes people have to earn the right to call us by certain names, through the special relationship we have developed with them over time. God has known us all our lives, even before we were born. God knows us, with all our gifts and our challenges. God loves us unconditionally, a state which is very hard for humans to fully understand.

Sometimes it is difficult to for us to conceptualise that God loves all God's creation without judgement and urges us to do the same. It was very special to be reminded that through this intimate relationship God has with us that we have all been created for a purpose; we are special and intentionally born to be of service in this world. Sometimes when people lose that sense of purpose they fall into a deep sadness in their lives. Remembering that God fully trusts us and is ready to support us simply by turning back to God, is worth remembering.

Last Saturday I met many families who are looking to enrol their children at St Patrick's Parramatta. After spending the day meeting them I could not help but marvel at these very precious young individuals who are just beginning to show signs of their personalities. My thinking is that it is not a fluke that we are gathered together in this community in Parramatta but that we have been called together for a reason; to create the Kingdom of God in this small space, at the corner of Ross and Villiers Streets. Growing a community together which embodies love and compassion, forgiveness and patience, trust and hope is not an easy task. Just as God intended, we are all very different and at times this difference may confuse and frustrate us. Our journey together asks that we work hard to recognise what is common between all members, that is the love of our children and the dream that they experience the best education possible in a community rich in Gospel Values.

Please keep in your prayers all families that are about to commence the educational journey with their little ones.

Future Care Mobile Dental Services

Information for Parents

What service is offered?

Future Care Mobile Dental Services is a unique initiative that provides high quality, on-site, general dental care to children aged 2-17. Under the Child Dental Benefits Schedule (CDBS), funded by the Australian Federal Government, our service for eligible* students comes at no cost to the school or the parents.

Who are the dentists?

Future Care Mobile Dental Services comprises of a team of accredited and experienced dentists with a keen desire to provide the essential dental care to your child.

What sort of services are provided?

After receiving written consent from you as their parent/guardian, your child will be provided the following services:

- Dental health education
- Comprehensive oral examination and treatment plan
- Cleaning of teeth and fluoride application
- If applicable (and with further parental consent) on our return visit to your school x-ray, fillings, fissure seals, extractions if required.

What does it cost?

Eligible students: *For eligible students the total benefit is capped at \$1000.00 over a two calendar year period. We confirm eligibility with Medicare prior to your child's consultation with our dentist.

Ineligible students: For students not covered under the CDBS we can provide the same level of preventative care for \$50.00 per student

Should X-Rays/fillings/fissure seals/extractions, etc. be required such will be detailed on the Treatment Plan that will be provided to your child. We normally return to the school to undertake this restorative work and contact all parents to explain what work is required and if agreed the child is booked into our clinic for our next visit. For students who are ineligible to be Bulk Billed we provide the parent with a quote as per the CDBS bulk billed fee schedule. Payment is available via EFT/Credit Card/PayPal for your convenience.

How can my child participate in the program?

Your child can participate in the program after filling in our consent form and medical questionnaire. We need these returned prior to your child being seen by our dentist.
