IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING NAPLAN ONLINE 2019

Dear Parents of Year 2 and Year 4 students,

Next year 2019 your child will be sitting for the NAPAN Online. Children at St Patrick's Parramatta will be joining other students in Australia in doing NAPLAN online. Up to this point students in Year 3 and 5 have completed NAPLAN testing using paper tests.

To optimize success it is suggested that all parents visit the NAPLAN link below and allow their child to 'play' using the practice tests. You do not need a code but only to follow the link provided. <u>http://www.nap.edu.au/online-assessment/public-demonstration-site</u>

Whilst the teachers will be spending a short time familiarizing them to the formatting of these tests the more comfortable the children are in using arrows, tabs, drop down menu for example the more relaxed and confident they will be.

What children will need:

- Devices: (All children will be using school provided chromebooks)
- Headphones: (Each child will need to bring their own headphone. It is recommended that they have headphones with soft caps covering the ear rather than earbuds ones. See table below. Perhaps Santa can bring them a set for Christmas.
- Practice: It is recommended that all students practice using the format provided in the tests by completing the practice tests especially numeracy. This test requires the students to use a digital ruler (found on the upper right hand corner, click once and drag) for example. It is important that children know how to use this feature.

This beautiful Advent Reflection was shared at last Saturday nights Christmas Carols at the Cathedral. I thought I would like to share it with you. Thank you Olivia Lee for assisting us to obtain a copy of it for you.

First Reading | Being Ready for Christmas by Fr Ron Rolheiser

Many of us arrive at Christmas tired, running, distracted, and already fatigued with the lights, songs, and celebrations of Christmas. Advent is meant to be a time of preparation for Christmas; but for many of us it is not exactly a time for the kind of preparation that enables Christ be born more deeply in our lives. Instead our preparation for Christmas is mostly a time of making ready to celebrate with our families, friends, and colleagues. The days leading up to Christmas are rarely serene.

Our time of preparation is generally more of a time to prepare our houses than a time to prepare our souls, more of a time of shopping than of prayer, and more of a time of already feasting than a time of fasting as a preparation for a feast. Today advent is perhaps more about already celebrating Christmas than it is about preparing for it.

And the end result is that, like the biblical innkeepers who had no room for Mary and Joseph at the first Christmas, we generally arrive at Christmas with "no room at the inn", no space in our lives for a spiritual rebirth. Our hearts are good, we want Christmas to renew us spiritually, but our lives are too pressured, too full of activity and tiredness, for us to have any real energy to make Christmas a special time of spiritual renewal for ourselves.

Everyone struggles with this in some fashion. No one is perfect; But it should also leave us with a pressing challenge: How do we ready ourselves to receive and remember Christ at this time?

Being ready for Christmas, does not depend upon getting everything neatly checked off on our to-do list.

Even if that list is only half done, if you find yourself in church at Christmas, if you find yourself at table with your family on Christmas day, and if you find yourself greeting your neighbors and colleagues with a little more warmth, then you've captured the Christ in Christmas.

2019 Diocesan School Fees

13 December 2018

Dear parents and carers

Please find below the Annual Diocesan fees schedule for 2019. The new schedule includes a very modest 2.7% increase on the fees from 2018.

School-based fees will also be limited to a 2.7% increase. School-based fees cover the costs of important things such as technology and school administration.

School fees are generally billed in instalments during Terms 1, 2 and 3. The fee is made up of three main parts:

1. Diocesan tuition fee

These are set by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta and are the same for every school. There are **significant sibling discounts** for families with more than one child at a Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta school (it does not have to be the same school).

Those discounts and a list of the annual Diocesan tuition fees for 2019 are outlined below.

2. Diocesan Building Levy

This fee is set by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta and is the same for every school. The annual Diocesan building levy for 2019 is \$804. There is only one Diocesan building levy per family with one or more children in a Parramatta Diocesan school or at St Dominic's College, Kingswood and it is billed in instalments over the first 3 terms of the year. A sibling discount of 50% is granted to families with children within the bordering Archdiocese of Sydney and Dioceses of Wollongong and Broken Bay.

3. School-based fees

These are determined by the school according to the needs of that school and billable for each child. Schoolbased fees are often called 'resource fees' or 'activity fees'. These fees help schools cover the costs of things like teaching resources, technology, excursions etc.



This fee varies between schools. Please contact the school to find out more about their school-based fees.

As a guide, the Diocesan tuition fee represents roughly half the overall fee per year.

Here's how we can help

We appreciate that from time to time, some families experience financial challenges. As well as sibling discounts, confidential fee support is available through the following means:

• Flexible payment options

Families enrolled in CEDP schools are offered flexible payment options at the start of each year. These options provide opportunities to select a payment plan that best suits you. Payments can be made by direct debit or BPay on a weekly, fortnightly or monthly basis at no additional charge.

• Fee assistance

We understand financial circumstances can change and that these changes can impact on families. Please speak with your school principal confidentially if your family experiences financial difficulty or hardship so an appropriate arrangement can be made.

Bishop Manning Scholarship Fund

In addition to fee assistance programs, the Bishop Manning Scholarship Fund is available to families who experience difficulty meeting the cost of school fees due to financial hardship. Part or full scholarships are also available to students enrolling in Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta schools. Byallawa co-contribution scheme

The Byallawa co-contribution scheme provides assistance to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander families to ensure a quality Catholic education is affordable and accessible*. Further information is available at www.scholarshipparra.catholic.edu.au.
