Dear Parents and Caregivers

Yesterday, Wednesday 17th February Year 1 to 6 gathered in the Cathedral to celebrate Ash Wednesday. It is marked by the distribution of ashes made from the burning of palms from the previous year's Palm Sunday. This was the first time most of the school gathered in the Cathedral since March 2020 and we thank the parish staff for ensuring that COVID safe procedures were in place. We all agreed how much we have missed returning to our school's spiritual home and look forward to continuing to gather for mass in the future.

This year my thinking around Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent, focuses on Prayer. I recently read a beautiful reflection about prayer on the website <u>A Catholic Life</u> which I would like to share with you. What I like most about this reflection is the author's comment that prayer is more than just a recitation of words that we recall but a living of one's life with God within. What an amazing concept! I invite you to read this simple reflection below.

One of the most important parts of true prayer is that it takes place deep in the inner room of your soul. It is there in the inner depths of your being that you will meet God. Saint Teresa of Ávila, one of the greatest spiritual writers in the history of our Church, describes the soul as a castle in which God dwells. Meeting Him, praying to Him and communing with Him requires that we enter into the deepest and innermost chamber within this castle of our soul. It is there, in the innermost dwelling, that the full glory and beauty of God is discovered.

God is not just a God who is "out there" far away in Heaven. He is a God who is closer and more intimate than we could ever imagine. Lent is a time, more than any other time of the year, when we must strive to make that journey inward so as to discover the Indwelling of the Most Holy Trinity.

What does God want of you this Lent? It's easy to begin Lent with more superficial commitments, such as giving up a favorite food or doing an extra good deed. Some choose to use Lent as a time to get in better physical shape, and others decide to dedicate more time to spiritual reading or other holy exercises. All of this is good and useful. But you can be certain that the deepest desire of our Lord for you this Lent is that you pray.


Prayer, of course, is much more than saying prayers. It's not only saying the rosary, or meditating upon Scripture, or reciting beautifully composed prayers. Prayer is ultimately a relationship with God. It's an encounter with the Triune God who dwells within you. True prayer is an act of love between you and your Beloved. It's an exchange of persons: your life for God's. Prayer is an act of union and communion by which we become one with God and God becomes one with us.

The great mystics have taught us that there are many levels to prayer. We often begin with the recitation of prayers, such as the beautiful prayer of the rosary. From there we meditate, ponder and reflect deeply upon the mysteries of our Lord and His life. We come to know Him more fully and, little by little, discover that we are no longer just thinking about God, but we are gazing at Him face to face.

As we begin the holy season of Lent, reflect upon your practice of prayer. If the images of prayer presented here intrigue you, then make a commitment to discover more. Commit yourself to the discovery of God in prayer. There is no limit and no end to the depth to which God wants to draw you through prayer. True prayer is never boring. When you discover true prayer, you discover the infinite mystery of God. And this discovery is more glorious than anything you could ever imagine in life.


Today marks the launch of the 200th anniversary of Catholic education in Australia. This is a very special anniversary for the St Patrick's Parramatta community for as you may be aware St Patrick's Parramatta;

An excerpt taken from the media release from <u>National Catholic</u> <u>Commission</u> states:

The bicentenary commemorates the anniversary of the first official Catholic school in Australia, founded in October 1820 by Irish Catholic priest Fr John Therry. The school, which Catholic historians believe was located on Hunter Street in Parramatta, taught 31 students. An Irish Catholic convict George Marley (also identified as George Morley), who was sent to the colony, opened the school for Fr Therry and ran it for three years. This school was transferred to the site of the present St Patrick's Cathedral in 1837 and was entrusted to the care of the Marist Brothers in 1875. Parramatta Marist High School, now located in Westmead and St Patrick's Primary, Parramatta trace their origins back to this first school.

Over this last week Children and staff from St Patrick's Parramatta have had the privilege of being involved in some of the preparations for this launch which I am hoping to share with you in due time. Our involvement includes a small feature in today Australian newspaper, involvement in a launch video and an invitation to contribute to a project yet to be named.

Please look out for further information this year on how St Patrick's will be celebrating this momentous 200 year anniversary in future communications.



From 'The Learning Pit'

Educational researcher, Lyn Sharratt speaks about the concept called "The Third Teacher". She acknowledges that "after parents and teachers, the environment is the third teacher. Thus, careful consideration and co-construction of the Third Teacher with students is extraordinarily important. Classroom walls that become interactive learning spaces and show evidence of use move from being "pretty" to "pretty useful". (Lyn Sharrat, (2018), Clarity)

Over the last few years the staff have been digging deeper into the impact of this concept to the way our classrooms look and how the students interact within them. When I began my teaching career the majority of my Christmas holiday time was spent cruising the aisles of educational shops searching for the perfect themed borders, pretty charts and inspirational quotes that I would use to fill the walls of my classroom. They were all professionally printed and looked 'nice' on the walls, filling the space, ready for the first day of school. Often these posters would remain up for the whole term, sometimes even longer. However at no stage did the students interact with them or use them to improve their learning, but rather they were often long forgotten dust collectors.

Thankfully our understanding of the impact of the environment as the 'Third Teacher' has developed and now we understand the importance of ensuring the learning space assists students with their current learning. As you enter the classrooms next week during the 'Meet and Greets' take time to look at the learning environment. Take note of how different it looks from when you were at school. I am sure you will see teachers are focussing on making sure the walls are full of information and exemplars that assist students in their learning by being:

- Relevant to the learning.
- Easy for the students to understand.
- Have been co-constructed with/by the students.
- Promote curiosity and inquiry.
- Show the steps needed for success in learning.
- Clearly state what the students are learning.

Ask your child to tell you about how they use the environment to improve their learning. I would be interested in hearing their response too.

TERM 1 2021 SCHOOL INVOICES

Term 1 2021 Statements have now been mailed to all families. Due date for payment of Term 1 fees is on or before **Wednesday 17th March 2021**.

The Catholic Education Office Flexible Payment Plan Booint or Book is offered as a convenient option for payment of 2021 fees. The information required for the Flexible Payment Plan is included in the Instalment 1 statement.

Please note:

Flexible Payment Plans (DIRECT DEBIT) are offered as alternative payment options for your School Fees.

BPOINT & BPAY

If you would like to accept this offer please complete the Flexible Payment Direct Debit eForm (Bpoint) by visiting https://www.parra.catholic.edu.au/fpp. If an eForm has not been received prior to the payment due date the Catholic Education Office will assume you do not wish to take up the flexible payment option plan and you will be paying the Term 1 school fees by the 17th March 2021. **BPAY** election requires you to set this up via your bank account by 16th March 2021 so the first payment occurs on 17th March 2021.
