Over the last few weeks I had an opportunity to read the children's Mid Year Reports. It was so good getting to know the children through their teacher's eyes and I was able to understand a little more about what the children are choosing to show their teachers about their learning journey.


What I found particularly interesting is the growth in the number of children who have been congratulated on their ownership of the learning by the positive manner to which they are accepting or considering the feedback given to them. I also noticed that for some children they are showing a particular strength in an area of interest such as Creative Arts, Science and Technology or History. I always find it fascinating that children show us their gifts from such a young age. Being able to contribute to group discussions is always a challenge for some children, especially the shy ones, and teachers do their best to create conditions so that all children are heard. I also congratulate children who are willing to get 'out of their comfort zone' in learning by trying something new or harder without giving up. This is often called a Growth Mindset.

Teachers are often challenged to keep what they wish to report on the children within the character/word count available. For this reason they sometimes use one subject specific word instead of the full explanation. To assist in clarifying some of these words I have once again included some of these subject specific words in this newsletter. This week the focus is Maths. The feedback last time these were shared was positive.

Efficient strategies:

Students solve problems using **non counting**, **mental** calculations. To do this they need **understanding and fluency** in using addition and subtraction facts to 20 and multiplication and division facts to 100.



Multiplicative:

Multiplicative situations are problems that involve multiplication or division. This can include using terms such as 'times as many' and 'each'. It can also include modelling arrays and working with ratios.



Partial Array:

This where some of the array is visible but the total collection of objects has to be deduced.

Subitising: This is where students recognise the number of objects in a collection without consciously counting


Array: An array is an ordered collection of objects or numbers. Rectangular arrays are

commonly used in primary mathematics.



This array shows six rows of 6.

<u> Maths Terminology</u>



A rich task is:

- one that engages all children
- challenging
- worked out using more than one strategy
- open if it involves more than one answer
- working mathematically


Eg

Does the triangle BAC have the same area as the triangle DAC?

Prove your thinking. Can you draw another triangle that would also have the same area?

Additive:

additive reasoning enables students to see some of the interesting possibilities for joining, separating, and comparing numbers.



Decade:

Decades are multiples of 10 (i.e. 10, 20, 30...). Bridging decades involves using multiples of 10 as landing points for adding and subtracting.




Eg 93 + 71 = 164 because 90 + 10 + 60 = 160, then 3+1 = 4 so 160 + 4 = 164

Friends of ten:

These are 2 numbers that add together to make 10. Students use 10 frames to see their friends of 10. They subitise how many altogether. They ask: How many more to make 10?





Students record the friends of 10 as 7 and 3. They know that the numbers commute and so they also know that 3 and 7 are friends of 10. They also investigate friends of 10 using subtraction. So they know that because 7 and 3 are friends of 10, then if we have 10 and we subtract 7, we'll have 3 and if we have 10 and we subtract 3, we'll have 7.



Informal measures


Informal units are not part of a standardised system of units for measurement. For example, an informal unit for length could be tiles of uniform length. An informal unit for area could be uniform paper squares of any size. Informal units are sometimes referred to as nonstandard units. Informal measures are used by Infants students before they move to using the standard units of the metric system.



Number Line: A number line gives a pictorial representation of real numbers.
