Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Last Sunday, 14th November I presented the Principal's Report at the Annual General Meeting at St Patrick's Cathedral. It was a good opportunity to let the parish community know a little about what happens at the school and how the school is linked to the parish. I spoke a little about the school history, our experiences of Remote Learning and presented some general information about the school.

It was also good to see the interest that parishioners have in St Patrick's Primary School and many were keen to catch up afterwards to have a chat about the school. I even met an 87 year old lady who was an ex-student of St Patrick's Parramatta and she described what it was like back then and how the school and her involvement in the parish inspired her to become a Catholic herself. St Patrick's Cathedral parish is an old parish and I reunited with mums of other ex-students, all with families of their own. I was greeted by many smiling and welcoming faces. The full Annual School Report will be available on the school website when published at the end of this year. This report is available yearly.

At this meeting various representatives also gave their reports commencing with the Dean of the Cathedral, Father Robert Riedling who thanked the parish for the welcome bestowed on him when arriving at St Patrick's. Mrs Marjory Jackman (MC), Mrs Kerry Guimelli (Parish Pastoral Council) and representatives of the Finance Committee all presented some information about the parish. It is fair to say that St Patrick's Cathedral Parish has involvement from many parishioners in a number of subgroups; each contributing to the life of the community. May I encourage you all to attend the Cathedral for weekly mass and to find a way to contribute using your own special gifts.

It was also an opportunity for the parish to say farewell to Deacon Rod Pirotta, who has been serving the Cathedral parish for 3 years. Deacon Rod has been assigned to Sacred Heart Parish at Mount Druitt.

In order to make the end of year as special as possible for the Year 6 students the following events will take place in Week 10.


As always I appreciate that you know that all decisions made in the school are driven by the importance the school places on the health and wellbeing of students and staff.

This will replace the last day of school celebrations (15th December) to minimize risk for all families.</p> <p>Dismissal as usual with no visitors on site will take place on December 15th.</p> <p>Students and their siblings will be permitted to leave to continue their celebrations in a hospitality venue of their choice. (This is optional as school is opened)</p>



Now that you have configured your login, each time you open the app, and select a school, you will be presented with Your Dashboard view for that school


Any children you have at that school will be displayed across the top. Tap on each student to access their details.
